# BACKGROUND NOTE Fifth ASEAN Inclusive Business Summit 2022

### **BACKGROUND AND RATIONALE**

- 1. The Inclusive Business (IB)¹ agenda was introduced in ASEAN in 2017 through a call by the ASEAN Leaders for greater emphasis on creating an enabling environment for IB. Since then, ASEAN has progressed in promoting IB in the region, having organised four (4) ASEAN Inclusive Business Summits, hosted by the Philippines, Thailand, ASEAN Coordinating Committee on Micro Small and Medium Enterprises/ ACCMSME with the support of United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP), and Brunei Darussalam, respectively. Further, the ASEAN Economic Ministers (AEM) endorsed the Guidelines for the Promotion of Inclusive Business in ASEAN² during the 52nd Meeting in August 2020.
- 2. Since the introduction of IB in ASEAN, Cambodia, through the Ministry of Industry, Science, Technology and Innovation (MISTI) has been at the forefront in championing IB at both the national and regional levels. In 2021, Cambodia has prepared a strategy for a better "enabling environment for Inclusive Business in Cambodia" (the IBeeC) and is currently implementing IBeeC under a multi-stakeholder approach, coordinated by the IBeeC Secretariat in MISTI Cambodia. Under Cambodia's ASEAN Chairmanship in 2022, The Royal Government of Cambodia, through the Ministry of Industry, Science, Technology and Innovation (MISTI), committed to host the **Fifth ASEAN Inclusive Business Summit** (hereinafter referred as "Fifth IB Summit).

#### STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES AND SCOPE

- 3. Aligned with the theme of Cambodia's Chairmanship of ASEAN 2022 ("ASEAN A.C.T: Addressing Challenges Together"), the motto of the Fifth ASEAN Inclusive Business Summit will be "Together <u>ASEAN IBee</u>3". The Fifth ASEAN Inclusive Business Summit will focus on supporting the implementation of the Guidelines for the Promotion of Inclusive Business in ASEAN, particularly on **IB investments incentives** policy instrument and its support mechanisms. To this end, the Fifth ASEAN Inclusive Business Summit will:
- (a) review the progress made in promoting a better enabling environment for IB enabling environment (IBee) in the various ASEAN countries and globally;
- (b) discuss opportunities for collaborating on policy promotion instruments such as business coaching, accreditation, impact monitoring and joint reporting, and risk reduction financing;

- (c) exchange on women economic empowerment and climate adaptation solutions through IB; and
- (d) provide a general forum for exchanging and learning from innovative IB business cases in the region.

#### **PARTICIPANTS**

4. The Fifth ASEAN Inclusive Business Summit will feature and attract multiple stakeholders involved in the IB ecosystem in ASEAN and beyond, including CEOs from companies with successful IB models, public officials strategically promoting inclusive businesses, representatives of business associations advocating IB, impact investors and financial institutions engaging in investment deals in IB, IB business facilitators, as well as development partners and civil society organisations supporting public and private sector initiatives for promoting IB. The Fifth ASEAN Inclusive Business Summit will be organised in hybrid format, where about 100 participants from Cambodia and 50 international participants are expected to join the summit in Siem Reap, Cambodia, and up to 250 international participants to join the Fifth ASEAN Inclusive Business Summit via online platform.

#### **EXPECTED OUTCOMES AND AGENDA**

- 5. The Fifth ASEAN Inclusive Business Summit will be a combination of panel discussions on IB policy promotion and parallel thematic and sector seminars. Companies with IB business lines will exchange on their investment cases and suggest how more and deeper social and commercial impact can be achieved through private investments stimulated through public incentives. The agenda will cover:
  - a) an exchange on the policy instruments for promoting IB companies focusing on business coaching, accreditation, impact monitoring and joint reporting, and risk reduction financing and the transformation to IB;
  - b) Discussions with suggestions the private sector to promote and support IB companies in ASEAN;
  - c) Women economic empowerment through IB and climate change solutions through IB";
  - d) IB innovations in various sectors, including agriculture;
  - e) Showcasing exhibition booths by the IB companies, as well as discussions between companies on a sector basis including concrete recommendations for institutionalising support programmes, and on how more and deeper social, commercial impact could be achieved through public incentives and linkages to other supporting tools; and
  - f) South-South exchanges between ASEAN and other countries.
- 6. The proposed agenda for the Fifth ASEAN Inclusive Business Summit appears as **Annex 1**.

#### ORGANISATIONAL ARRANGEMENTS

7. The Fifth ASEAN Inclusive Business Summit will be organised by the Royal Government of Cambodia in cooperation with the ASEAN Secretariat and development partners, i.e. ESCAP, iBAN<sup>4</sup>, OECD, and OXFAM. The Fifth ASEAN Inclusive Business Summit will be a two-days event held in a hybrid format through in-person and online discussions. Participation is free of charge.
